IGNITING COMPASSION AND HOPE FOR UKRAINIAN REFUGEES AND HOLOCAUST SURVIVORS IN KRAKOW, POLAND

In the face of adversity, Federation and our partner agency, **JCC Krakow** extended care to both the Jewish community in Krakow and Ukrainian refugees around the world. Nearly 80 years since the end of World War II, today there is a vibrant Jewish community in Krakow that is able to support these refugees with solace and a warm embrace.

In the past year, there has been a surge in the number of Ukrainians seeking refuge at the JCC Krakow's distribution point. Each day, a staggering **400-500 individuals gather to receive food packages**, their eyes reflecting the resilience and determination that brought them from Ukraine, where they escaped the ravages of bombings and the cruel grip of a harsh winter with little warmth or sustenance.

Our hearts are moved by their courage and their impact, while JCC Krakow opens their doors to **provide support for 300 Ukrainians daily**. Our focus is on those most vulnerable, whose stories enrich the tapestry of our Jewish community.

In partnership with the JCC Krakow, our commitment extends to nurturing the **Jewish community of 800+ members**, ensuring their well-being and growth through comprehensive educational programs, joyous holiday celebrations, and vital welfare support.



SUPERHEROES AMONG US

THE IMPACT OF FEDERATION'S INCLUSION SERVICES



Nancy is the definition of a superhero, as she learned how to navigate life as a mom of a child with autism. Taking one day at a time, learning and growing as a parent, she soon found strength and solace from the Jewish Federation of South Palm Beach County's Disability and Inclusion liaison, and many of Federation's partner agency programs and services.

Ruth & Norman Rales Jewish Family Services (JFS), and **Jewish Adoption and Foster Care Options (JAFCO)**, offered Nancy the much-needed parent and caregiver support.

Her son Josh, a curious and compassionate boy, yet hesitant and minimally verbal, discovered his sanctuary in **Marleen Forkas Camp Kavod** at the **Adolph & Rose Levis Jewish Community Center**. The Fit and Fun program became his haven, where he not only had fun but also developed newfound communication skills.

Another bright spot in Josh's journey is **Friendship House**, an affiliate of **Chabad of Boca**, where he receives love and care tailored to his needs along with other peers. Over time, he has grown to be more verbal and enjoy new experiences.

Nancy is truly passionate about her gratitude for the Federation and its partner agencies: "I formed deep friendships with other moms outside the support group, realizing that I was not alone on this journey."

The sense of community and support made Nancy feel empowered, as she has the tools and resources to help her family. For Josh, he found a community where he truly belonged, where he could have fun and engage in fulfilling activities.

Now Nancy can say that Josh is the real superhero. "He feels stronger, like he belongs, and he loves life, each and every day. Sky's the limit!"

IN OUR LOCAL COMMUNITY, THOSE IN THEIR DARKEST TIMES OVERCOME

This past spring, Paula and her husband Chuck had one of those perfect days at their home in Boca Raton. As Paula recalls, “The kind of day that when I was falling asleep that night, I had a smile on my face.”

However, Paula’s nightmare soon began as Chuck had sudden shortness of breath, and collapsed without warning. Within 24 hours, he was on a respirator and in a coma. Sadly, Chuck never regained consciousness and passed away ten days later. Paula was faced with a reality she had no control over. “How do I possibly learn to go from 45 years of ‘we’ to a future of just ‘me’?” she asked in a moment of desperation and hopelessness.

Shortly after Chuck’s passing, Paula saw an ad in her synagogue newsletter announcing **Ruth & Norman Rales Jewish Family Services** was starting a bereavement group. Although she was not sure she had the emotional strength to talk about her gut wrenching loss in an in-person setting, she decided to attend.

The bereavement group was, in fact, what Paula needed. It not only gave her a safe space to be vulnerable and share her darkest thoughts; it allowed Paula to create strong bonds and friendships with those who are going through similar situations. Today, Paula’s strength is not only helping herself, but being there for others.



CROSSROADS JERUSALEM

WHERE TEENS AND YOUNG ADULTS THRIVE

As in our own community in South Palm Beach County, in Israel, the issue of mental health is prevalent among teens and young adults. A recent report shows that major depression diagnoses among teens aged 12-17 rose by 39% in 2021. Diagnoses of anxiety is up 33%, stress and emotional distress 20%, and eating disorders have jumped 56%. For young adults, the trendlines are similar.

We understand that behind this data are human beings whose minds and hearts are being shaped through their own life experiences. As a partner agency of our Federation, **Crossroads Jerusalem** provides essential prevention and intervention programs for Anglo teens and young adults in Israel in order to reach their potential and thrive.

Crossroads uniquely offers teens subsidized therapy in their native language which is critical to mental health care. Each Crossroads social worker has a caseload of teenagers with whom he or she meets for individual therapy on a regular basis. Furthermore, they act as case managers, accompanying teens on visits to various community services and maintaining contact with the clients' families. One teen aptly shared, "If it weren't for Crossroads, I wouldn't be alive."

Most of all, at Crossroads, teens learn to help themselves, to seek help for themselves, and to trust the assistance of our social service professionals. And what better way can we ensure that communities thrive, especially in Israel. Helping lives. Saving lives. Investing in the next generation.

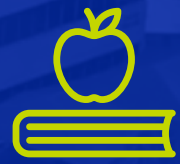

EDUCATE

A TEACHABLE MOMENT - FROM HATRED INTO COURAGE

In a Middle School in Boca Raton, Florida, an unsettling incident of antisemitism shook the halls. Two students, fueled by ignorance and hate, marched down the corridor, shouting antisemitic remarks into unsuspecting classrooms. The school district recognized the gravity of this moment and because of their long standing relationship with the Jewish Federation of South Palm Beach County, knew they could reach out for help. Together they transformed this hateful moment into an opportunity for education and empathy.

They arranged a meeting between the two young perpetrators and their parents with two Holocaust survivors. Their survival stories from the Auschwitz concentration camp and exile from Belgium left a profound impact on the boys. The Federation carefully explained the historical background of the Holocaust and the atrocities committed against Jewish people and other minorities under Hitler's regime.

As the survivors shared their personal testimonies, one of the survivors rolled up his sleeve, revealing the haunting tattoo, a number that the Nazis had given him. One of the boys couldn't hold back his tears, suddenly grasping the horror of his actions. The meeting left an indelible mark on him, and he committed to sharing the survivors' stories with his friends and peers.

The lesson learned was powerful: by changing the mindset of just one child and one parent, an entire generation can be influenced positively. The ripple effect of empathy and understanding will infiltrate the school, helping to quash hate and fostering a culture of acceptance and love.

FAU HILLEL STUDENTS SPREAD CREAM CHEESE AND NOT HATE



In a powerful display of solidarity, Hillel students took a stand at **Florida Atlantic University** against the rising tide of antisemitism on November 7, 2022. Under the banner of “Spread Cream Cheese and Not Hate,” these passionate young individuals organized an event that sparked a movement of change. With over 500 pledges to combat anti-Semitism on campus and in the wider community, their efforts showcased the vital role of educational institutions in fostering safe and inclusive spaces for all.

Amidst the troubling surge of anti-Semitic remarks across the country, the FAU Hillel students recognized the urgent need to address the issue head-on. Armed with bagels and a wealth of educational information, they engaged their fellow students in heartfelt conversations, shedding light on the dangerous consequences of hate speech.

The impact of this event extended far beyond the campus grounds. As one of the partner agencies of the Federation, FAU Hillel’s resolute stance against hate was embraced by a wider community. The event stood as a testament to the unwavering commitment of these young individuals and the belief that education and unity can triumph over prejudice.

Hillel of Broward and Palm Beach - and all of our students - remain steadfast in the mission to create a safe and welcoming environment, nurturing a new generation of compassionate leaders who will shape a brighter, more inclusive future for all.
